Trip Breakdown and Report:

Day 1: 25 November 2019 - Pilanesberg National Park

Our group met up in Johannesburg near OR Tambo International Airport, and we immediately departed for Pilanesberg National Park, picking up our first few birds along the highway en route. Upon arriving at the Park, we immediately checked in and offloaded our gear at our very comfortable accommodation – Bakubung Game Lodge. We added a few more regular species in the lodge grounds, before heading into the Park for 2 hours, before returning to hop onto the evening guided game drive.

Our bird tally grew quickly, as we added species such as African Wattled Lapwings, Greenwinged Pytilia, Red-faced Mousebirds, Speckled Pigeon, Lesser Grey Shrike, Groundscraper Thrush, and Dusky Indigobird at the western extremity of its highveld range. African Black Duck surprised us on the open water of Lengau Dam, as it was accompanied by Knob-billed Ducks and African Spoonbill. While the other spots of open water added Caspian Tern and Great Egret. Nice transition zone species included Capped Wheatear, Black-throated Canary, Marico Flycatcher, Kalahari Scrub-Robin, White-browed Sparrow-Weaver, and Rufous-cheeked Nightjar just after sunset, which is always a win.

On the mammal front we were delighted to find 5 Mountain Reedbuck a mere 2km into the Park, very uncommon in these parts, and this was followed by a pride of 5 lions lazing about in the short grass near Ruighoek Dam, and then a great sighting of 3 Black Rhinos together (a bull, cow and growing calf – probable mating going on), one of the old Kruger bull Elephants passed us within a metre or two, and many Hippo with calves grazing around Mankwe Dam during delicious sundowers.

The eventful day was ended with the most scrumptious buffet dinner, with an extraordinary selection, and some delectable red wine.

Route: Johannesburg to Pilanesberg National Park (238km).

Weather: Partly cloudy most of the day.

Temperature range: 19-29°C.

Birds of the Day: Capped Wheatear, Rufous-cheeked Nightjar, Dusky Indigobird, African Black

Duck.


Mammals of the Day: Mountain Reedbuck, 3 Black Rhino together, lazy Lion pride, large Elephant

Day 2: 26 November 2019 - Pilanesberg to Nylsvley

The next day proved to be the most productive of the trip. We headed out early on a morning drive into the Park, returned to pack, and then headed back through the Park to exit through Bakgatla Gate. This

added, amongst many others: Cinnamon-breasted Bunting, Mocking Cliff-Chat, Desert Cisticola, Long-billed Crombec, Namaqua Dove, African Fish-Eagle, Black-chested Snake-Eagle, Hamerkop, Glossy Ibis, Black-chested Prinia, Cape Sparrow, Marabou Stork, Chestnut-vented Tit-Babbler, Black-cheeked Waxbill, and Violet-eared Waxbill.

We departed Pilanesberg for Zaagskuilsdrift, and travelled through the Waterberg. This route added some good birds along the way, as well as many interesting and exotic mammal sightings through the fences of the many breeding and hunting farms. New birds included Red-billed Buffalo-Weaver, Red-headed Weaver, Giant Kingfisher, Purple Roller, Common House Martin, Shikra, Scalyfeathered Finch, and then the great surprise of Great Spotted Cuckoo flyby.

Our time on the Zaagskuilsdrift road added others, including Southern Pied Babbler, Ant-eating Chat, Northern Black Korhaan, Woodland Kingfisher, Bearded Scrub-Robin, Magpie Shrike, Wattled Starling, and Intermediate (Yellow-billed) Egret.

We then headed toward Nylsvley for our overnight stop at the charming and luxury Zwahili Private Game Lodge & Spa. Along the back roads of this route we were pleasantly surprised by good sightings of Mosque Swallow, Chestnut-backed Sparrow-Lark, Greater Kestrel, and a distant flock of Lesser Kestrels.

On the mammal front we added some interesting ones, such as White Rhino, Red Hartebeest, and Eland in Pilanesberg, and then Golden Wildebeest, Sable, and Springbok in the game farms.

After a fair amount of travel, the productive day ended with a great meal and some choice beverages and wine.

Route: Pilanesberg to Zaagskuilsdrift to Zwahili (332km).

Weather: Partly cloudy most of the day.

Temperature range: 20-32°C.

Birds of the Day: Great Spotted Cuckoo, Southern Pied Babbler, Northern Black Korhaan,

Mosque Swallow, Chestnut-backed Sparrow-Lark, Greater Kestrel.

Mammals of the Day: White Rhino, Eland, Sable. Daily Bird Total: 142 seen and 3 heard.

Daily Mammal Total: 20 seen.

Day 3: 27 November 2019 - Nylsvley to Woodbush Forest Reserve

Early the next morning, we set off on an enjoyable open safari vehicle game drive around Zwahili. Some of what we picked up included Orange-breasted Bush-Shrike, Red-crested Korhaan, Common Ostrich, Willow Warbler, Marico Sunbirds, Black-crowned Tchagra, and Violet-backed Starling. We also enjoyed great views of Eland and a pair of Lions.

We then departed for Nyslvley in the hope of finding water and wetland, only to be sorely disappointed – it was still dry as a bone, which really dented our rallid and waterbird count. Nonetheless, we encountered the following new birds within the reserve Acacia Pied Barbet, Lark-like Bunting, Rock Martin, Long-tailed Paradise Whydah.

So, we pressed on toward Polokwane Nature Reserve in the hopes of locating Short-clawed Lark, only to dip on that. We did add Burnt-necked Eremomela and Crimson-breasted Shrike however,

before pressing on further toward Magoebaskloof and our 2-night stop at Bramasole Guesthouse, near the base of Woodbush Forest Reserve.

The drive into Bramasole passed a wetland and stream, which produced Yellow Bishop, Dark-capped Yellow Warbler, and some surprise out-of-range White-backed Mousebirds. We then briefly walk through the gardens and mistbelt forest before sunset, which rendered Chorister Robin-Chat, White-browed Robin-Chat, and Yellow-bellied Greenbul.

Another busy day through varied habitats ended with a great dinner and a very comfortable sleep at the eclectic and stylish Bramasole, with its artsy style and culture-themed rooms.

Route: Zwahili Private Game Lodge & Spa to Nylslvley Nature Reserve to Polokwane

Nature Reserve to Magoebaskloof (228km).

Weather: Clear. Temperature range: 19-32°C.

Birds of the Day: Burnt-necked Eremomela, Crimson-breasted Shrike, Lark-like Bunting, Dark-

capped Yellow Warbler, White-backed Mousebird.

Mammals of the Day: Eland, Lion.

Daily Bird Total: 111 seen and 4 heard.

Daily Mammal Total: 21 seen.

Day 4: 28 November 2019 – Woodbush Forest Reserve and surrounds

We awoke and set off at dawn to climb up into the glorious Woodbush Forest. The new species for the trip started flowing thick and fast, starting with Greater Double-collared Sunbirds, Cape Canary and Forest Canary. We then headed up to the Forest Hut and immediately picked up our main target while still in the car park, a small flock of 4 Cape Parrots settled right overhead with a few African Olive Pigeons. This was shortly followed by a walk into a pristine indigenous forest section, which roved a treasure trove — we added Terrestrial Brownbul, Olive Bush-Shrike, magnificent African Emerald Cuckoos, superb views of White-starred Robin, Narina Trogon, Yellow-streaked Greenbul, and on the way out, Olive Woodpecker and Grey Cuckooshrike.

We headed back to Bramasole for brunch, added Barratt's Warbler and Bar-throated Apalis near the stream before the gate, and enjoyed the beautifully landscaped gardens. We then visited Haenertsburg for some supplies, and stopped at Stanford Lake en route, where we added Woollynecked Stork, White-throated Swallow, African Swamphen and White-winged Tern. From there we headed onto the open grasslands of the Louis Changuion Trail, where we added Alpine Swift, Drakensberg Prinia and Long-crested Eagle.

After a light lunch we climbed Forest Drive toward Debengeni Falls, and picked up Blue-mantled Crested Flycatcher, White-throated Robin-Chat, Sombre Greenbul and Chorister Robin-Chat. At the Falls, we enjoyed fantastic views of Mountain Wagtail. Shortly after, we ascended higher up the trail and included Knysna Turaco, and another big target – Black-fronted Bush-Shrike. As the sun began setting, we added a lovely flock of Swee Waxbills.

After another very productive and active day that included many endemics and specials, we relaxed to another tasty dinner and good rest.

Route: Around Woodbush Forest and Haenertsburg.

Weather: Clear or partly cloudy most of the day.

Temperature range: 14-33°C.

Birds of the Day: Cape Parrot, Black-fronted Bush-Shrike, Barratt's Warbler, African Emerald

Cuckoo.

Mammals of the Day: Samango Monkey.

Daily Bird Total: 99 seen and 3 heard.

Daily Mammal Total: 2 seen and 1 heard.

Day 5: 29 November 2019 – Magoebaskloof to Balule Private Game Reserve

The following morning, we explored the forest above Bramasole and the gardens and enjoyed great views of Chorister Robin-Chat, Cape Parrots gave a most welcome flyover, Cape Batis, Terrestrial Brownbul, Olive Bush-Shrike and Brimstone Canary. We then packed to depart on a descent into the lower altitudes as we pushed on through Tzaneen towards our next destination, Toro Yaka Game Lodge in the Balule Private Game Reserve – part of the Greater Kruger.

The heat was really starting to set in, especially as we descended the escarpment into the drier lowveld. En-route to Balule, we visited the old Bat Hawk nest site near Agatha. Unfortunately, we learnt from a passing forester that they had left the nest a few weeks prior.

So, we continued on our journey, picking up Pearl-breasted Swallow, Malachite Kingfisher and Cape Weaver from a river bridge, and this was followed by Brown Snake-Eagle, just before arriving at the Balule entrance. The heat was really starting to set in, and on our drive through to Toro Yaka we added Tawny Eagle and a few others.

After settling into the lovely quaint lodge, we set off on our evening open safari vehicle drive, adding numerous bushveld species. However, the real highlights of the drive were on the mammal – front a coalition of 2 dominant male lions, which put on a very impressive roaring territorial display from only a few metres of us. After delightful sundowners and snacks around a dam filled with grunting hippos, the excitement and appreciation levels grew further when we encountered a gorgeous African Wild Cat on the hunt, which stayed near our vehicle for several minutes pursuing small prey items. Within a minute of leaving this we bumped into a Black Rhino in the darkness.

The eventful day was ended with the most scrumptious dinner set around the pool deck beneath the starry sky.

Route: Magoesbaskloof to Tzaneen to Balule to Toro Yaka Game Lodge (192km).

Weather: Clear most of the day.

Temperature range: 14-34°C.

Birds of the Day: Cape Parrot, Tawny Eagle

Mammals of the Day: African Wild Cat, Black Rhino, 2 male Lions roaring

Daily Bird Total: 78 seen and 11 heard

Daily Mammal Total: 13 seen.

Day 6: 30 November 2019 - Balule Private Game Reserve to Dullstroom

The next morning we set off early on another open safari vehicle drive for the Olifants River, quite a distance from camp. Along the way, we found Red-headed Weavers and Red-billed Buffalo Weavers, and then on our approach to the perennial river a very large rusty-toned raptor alighted from the riverine tree, but only fleeting glimpses were possible before it disappeared from view – there was a strong belief that it was a Pel's Fishing-Owl, but cannot be sure. A real misfortune, as it was our primary target.

Nonetheless, we did see a whole lot more, including an African Crowned-Eagle, Green-backed (Striated) Heron, and feeding in the Sycamore Figs were several African Green Pigeons. We then left the vehicle to enjoy good hot drinks and snacks, and to explore the river bank on foot, adding White-fronted Bee-eaters and Jacobin Cuckoo. Upon jumping back onto the vehicle, we drove the riverbank road and enjoyed a White-backed Vulture with an immature bird on its nest, as well as Goliath Heron and Black Stork mid-stream.

We then started pulling away from the river, to return to the lodge. We had not ventured far before a pair of African Hawk-Eagles performed a fly-over. Upon discovering a small herd of elephant, we again alighted from the vehicle and our guide lead us up to within 35m of them on foot, for a more real encounter. We then found Common Scimitarbill, African Paradise-Flycatcher, African Mourning Dove, Green Woodhoopoe, and many others before arriving back at the lodge for a delicious brunch.

Sadly, we had to depart, up the pass for different habitats on the Mpumalanga highlands. We stopped at the JG Strydom Tunnel with hopes of sighting Taita Falcons, but we dipped on these. However, they were replaced by an extraordinary high-speed and acrobatic display by three extraordinary Peregrine Falcons, that have chased the Taitas off their renowned nesting sites and have replaced them. We then added Cape Crow and Booted Eagle while en route to the extraordinary moist altitudinal grasslands and rocky cliffs of Mount Anderson Wildlife and Water Catchment Reserve, which forms the source of the acclaimed Sand River.

Upon reaching Mount Anderson we were delighted to add Buffy Pipit, Plain-backed Pipit, Croaking Cisticola and Fiscal Flycatcher, amongst many others. On the mammal front we found Mountain Reedbuck, a herd of 6 Oribi and numerous others.

We then departed for our overnight destination at the magnificent Walkersons Hotel & Spa in the spectacular Walkersons Country Estate – what a special destination to spend our final night of this great trip. On the drive through the estate to the hotel we were treated to a pair of Cape Clawless Otters hunting through the weired waterways. The eventful day ended with great country accommodation, welcome drinks and a high class a la carte dinner.

Route: Toro Yaka to Hoedspruit, to JG Strydom to Mount Anderson to

Walkersons (211km).

Weather: Clear most of the day.

Temperature range: 19-34°C.

Birds of the Day: Plain-backed Pipit, Buffy Pipit, Booted Eagle, Black Stork

Mammals of the Day: Mountain Reedbuck, Oribi, Cape Clawless Otter.

Daily Bird Total: 120 seen and 9 heard.

Daily Mammal Total: 14 seen.

Day 7: 01 December 2019 - Dullstroom to White River

The next morning we headed out early through Walkersons for the special Verloren Vallei Nature Reserve. We were barely out the parking area when we were treated to a delightful Klaas' Cuckoo pair in a gorgeous courtship display. A little further down the road toward the estate gate we discovered Cape Grassbirds. We again stopped at a small weir to find a Lesser Swamp Warbler.

We then exited and headed off for Verloren Vallei, and soon picked up Jackal Buzzard, Fantailed Widowbird and Long-tailed Widowbird. We drove the border road while waiting for the reserve gate to open, and were treated to many delights, including Wing-snapping Cisticola, displaying Yellowbreasted Pipit, Eastern Long-billed Lark, Pale-crowned Cisticola, Cape Longclaw, a Sentinel Rock-Thrush pair and a scurrying Yellow Mongoose, which proved a great start.

Upon entering the reserve, we found Rock Kestrel flying low overhead, Malachite Sunbirds, Buff-streaked Chats, Banded Martin, Streaky-headed Seedeater, and Common Quail. We also picked up distant views of a flock of Blue Cranes, Black Wildebeest and Common Reedbuck.

Unfortunately, with so much of this gem of a reserve still to explore, we needed to return to Walkersons for a delightful brunch and to check out. Bidding this gorges estate goodbye, we headed for the Tonteldoos Road in search of more treats. We first discovered Red-throated Wryneck and Cinnamon-breasted Bunting, and finished off the new birds with great views of a major target, the endemic Ground Woodpecker.

It was time to head for the drop-off point in White River, so we headed down the N4 pass, and had one last stop at Milly's in Machadadorp, where we added our last new bird, Whiskered Terns. We pushed on to the guesthouse in White River, and just before dropping our client, we had one last search for the local Bat Hawk pair, but these again evaded us.

All-in-all, it was a magical trip that produced so many great special and endemic birds, and delivered handsomely on the mammal front as well. Our Belgian client was very pleased with the outcome of the tri and the great adventure we had just undertaken together. He was amazed at the extraordinary biodiversity offering, habitat range and scenic beauty is on offer in the north-eastern arts of this glorious country.

Route: Walkersons to Verloren Vallei to around Dullstroom to White River (142km).

Weather: Clear most of the day.

Temperature range: 14-31°C.
